












## Celebrating the Past

Remembering the days of small beginnings....

1915 Twenty-three people met and organized a Baptist church in Joelton, Tennessee. The first services were held in a brush arbor on property owned by charter member, George Milliken (pictured below with Jasper Milliken, left, another charter member). George was an ordained minister who loved to preach, and he did so at every opportunity. During inclement weather, the group would move into a tobacco barn.

**1916** The first church building was completed in 1916. Though remodeled a number of times, it was utilized until the sanctuary we now call the Salt House was built on the same spot in 1963.

1930 The church obtained its first loan of approximately \$3,000 from Whites Creek Bank in order to expand and improve the building. Average Sunday School attendance did climb to over 100 in 1931, but the church struggled under that debt for years to come. The incurred debt necessitated some ingenuity in raising funds. Festivals were held, quilts and aprons were made and sold, and the pastor's salary was paid with eggs and chickens.

1956 Church members moved to begin construction on a new educational building by borrowing \$25,000. For the first time, many Sunday School classes had spacious, permanent rooms, rather than just a portion of the auditorium. The church also gained its first indoor restrooms.

1963 The original sanctuary was built along with a basement for church events and educational space. The work was financed through the sale of \$100,000 in bonds. The old auditorium, erected in 1916 by the charter members, was removed to make way for the new building. Throughout the summer of 1963 services were held in a large tent with a sawdust floor as members watched the work in progress.

**1987** Our current office facilities, family life center, and educational space were constructed. This was financed through the sale of bonds and the S.E.E.D.S. program, in which members were asked to make a weekly gift above their regular tithes and offerings.

1999 Construction
on the new sanctuary was
completed under a campaign called
"Joelton Crossing the Jordan." Much of
the necessary funding to meet equipment
needs was met through voluntary gifts and
special memorials.

**2005** God continues to move in our church as we celebrate 90 years as a church family this year! In those 90 years, we have planted four additional churches. the most recent of which is 24 Church in Pleasant View in January of 2005. God continues to bless us with people who want to be a part of our church family, but we are completely out of space for our growing number of pre-schoolers and children. The Generations campaign was conceived in order to deal with our space problem and look beyond to what God is going to do here in the future. While we celebrate our incredible past, we must challenge our present membership to claim the future for Jesus Christ.

We have grown beyond the limits of our space, and God continues to bless us with people seeking to be a part of FBCJ. In response to this blessing, we must provide additional space in order to welcome those who come in the future. The scope, quality and location of our facilities are significant and will be the foundation for how we effectively impact the generations to come.

The chart in the lower left corner details how we have steadily grown in worship attendance while our Sunday School growth has remained the same due to the lack of educational space. You can also see from this chart that our worship attendance has leveled out over the past 3 years. This too can be linked to our lack of space for children and preschoolers. The disturbing result is that young families with children are going elsewhere because we have no room for their children.

It is our belief that Sunday School numbers will continue to rise as we are able to offer safe and trusted facilities for our children. We also believe that our worship attendance will continue to rise as young families become committed to this church and its children's programs. Building this new children's building will give us the much needed space for our

preschoolers and children, as well as provide new educational space for our overall educational ministry to grow effectively.

















God has placed a vision before our church of "impacting our communities with the hope, peace and purpose of Jesus Christ." Our church desires to make this impact through spiritual and numerical growth, and through further development of our facilities and resources. These are not separate goals or components of the vision; all are interrelated into a single, unified journey for our church that will last throughout generations to come. By renovating our current facilities and constructing new buildings, FBCJ will house places of ministry that will more strategically and intentionally reach our community and claim the next generation. Below you will find a detailed look at what will be happening over the next 10 years.

## Phase One (1-2 years)

#### A. Construct /furnish Children's Building

- Approximate cost: \$5 million
- Rooms for children ages birth-fifth grade
- Preschool multi-purpose room
- Children's worship area with multi-media

## B. Institute parking ministry

- Offer valet for the elderly, handicapped, and mothers of infants
- Assign parking lot greeters and directors

#### C. Renovation of kitchen facility

- Enlarge kitchen
- Upgrade to commercial appliances

## D. Development of master plan for the next 5–10 years

- Evaluations of scheduling and staffing needs
- Growth evaluations
- Land acquisition studies
- · Leadership development
- Assess ministry and/or facility needs for senior adults, singles, families, youth, children, homebound, missions, in-reach and outreach, etc.

#### E. Other major renovations/construction

- Upgrade church sign (donated by senior adult ministry, 39er's and Forerunners)
- New roof for Family Life Center

#### Phase Two (2-5 years)

#### F. Publicize Master Plan for FBCJ

- Brochures, drawings and schematics
- Step by step plans of implementation

#### G. Pay off sanctuary

• 1.6 million owed at 4.5% interest

## H. Renovation of current pre-school and nursery space

 Transition team is currently evaluating best use of this space so that work can take place immediately after we move into the children's building

## I. Renovation of current upstairs children classroom space

- Reconfiguring walls and doorways to make the space more effective for adult educational space
- Reconfiguring signage

#### J. Renovation of current youth space

- Upgrade sound system and lights in the Salt House
- Upgrade downstairs classrooms with TVs and DVD's
- New carpet and paint in Salt House
- Improve room acoustics
- · Reconfigure stage and storage space

#### Phase Three (4–10 years)

## K. Implementation of Master Plan

 Pursue future needed construction projects and continue to impact our communities with the hope, peace and purpose of Jesus Christ.

#### L. Retire debt on children's building

Total cost of \$5 million

NOTE: Many of the renovations and assessments will occur simultaneously, and the order could change should future needs and/or feasibility change. Our goal is to complete all of the above projects, continue to plan for the future, and be debt free in less than ten years.













## The Opportunity to Leave a Legacy

We believe it is a privilege to be a part of the exciting work God is doing at First Baptist Church Joelton. We now have the opportunity to prepare together for the future God has set before us. The new children's building will not only continue to bless us and our families, but will bless our community and future generations as well.

For the next 36 months, we will each need to make a special commitment, in addition to our regular giving, so that our new children's building can be built. This is our opportunity to leave a legacy for future generations.

- · Ask God what He would have you give to make this vision a reality.
- Trust God to provide what He impresses you to give.
- The scriptures do not teach equal giving but equal sacrifice to accomplish God's work.


## **Three Ways to Give:**

- 1. Give a cash gift. Ask God for creative ways to increase your gift. You might consider cash from savings, tax refunds, garage sales, or an extra part-time job. Also consider reducing your expenses or deferring a major purchase as a sacrifice to God. Involve your whole family in giving a specific amount.
- 2. Make a 36 month Faith Commitment. The Bible teaches that spiritual maturity includes developing the habit of regular giving. Giving our tithes, the first portion of our income, shows that God really has the first place in our lives. Giving above our tithes and offerings shows a faith in God's provision. You can give far more than you thought possible when it's spread out over time. (See the "My Potential Giving Schedule" chart on the next page.)
- 3. Give stocks, securities or other assets.

## What Should I do?

#### **FIRST, PRAY**

Sacrificial giving moves us outside of our comfort zone and stretches our faith as we take steps to give beyond our normal tithes and gifts. Let the amount of your gift be a matter of prayer each day as you seek to find what God wants you to give.

For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability...but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then to us in keeping with God's will. -2 CORINTHIANS 8:3-5



## **SECOND, DISCUSS IT**

Individuals and families should take time to discuss this matter and seek God's guidance. It is a perfect time for the entire family to be involved in the decision you make. Remember, we are building for our future generations.

These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. [7] Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. —DEUTERONOMY 6:6-7

## THIRD. MAKE YOUR COMMITMENT

Once you pray and faithfully seek God's guidance, then express that faith on a commitment card. The challenge that God has placed before us will only become reality through the sacrificial commitment of us all.

Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. —2 CORINTHIANS 9:7

## **My Potential Giving Schedule**

The chart to the right will help you understand what a three year faith commitment looks like. For example, if you give \$25 per week for the next three years and multiply that amount by 52 weeks for each year, you will have given a total of \$3,900 for that three year span!

## How much will it cost and how will we pay for it?

The total cost of the new children's building will be \$5 million. We currently owe \$1.6 million on the new sanctuary. Through faith commitments over the next three years we plan to raise over \$2.5 million. Assuming continued growth and a continued effort on all of our parts to be obedient to God's vision, we hope to be completely debt free within 9 years. Keep in mind that as we grow within those 9 years, we will continue to build and grow to effectively "Impact our communities with the hope peace and purpose of Jesus Christ." God's work is never done!

#### When will we pay off the current debt on the sanctuary?

On January 2, 2000, we dedicated our new sanctuary. Bro. David had a replica of the Ark of the Covenant constructed, and it sits behind the baptistery to this day. Inside the Ark are several items that have been locked away since that day in 2000. They will be revealed on the day we pay off the new sanctuary. We project this great event to happen within two years of the start of the Generations campaign.

## When will it start and how long will it take to complete the children's building?

Ground breaking for the Children's building is projected to be in August, 2005. It is approximately a year long building process which will allow us to move in sometime in fall of 2006.

#### When will the other renovations take place?

The kitchen renovation will have to take place as soon as ground breaking occurs due to its close proximity to the children's building. The kitchen will be completed in less than 6 weeks. Other renovations of areas now occupied by children and preschool will take place after we move into the new building.

# Frequently Asked Questions

## What do you mean by the term "Master plan"?

A Master plan is a written statement of our church's assumptions about its direction, organization, finances and vision. Churches that develop a clear master plan find that it increases team spirit because everyone "plays off the same sheet of music." It also increases the clarity required for growing the church, solving problems, orientating new staff, communicating effectively and making wise decisions that help the church carry out the vision.

## How is my Generations faith commitment different from my tithe?

Your tithe represents 10% of the financial blessings the Lord gives you on a regular basis. FBCJ uses your tithe for our general fund operations, which would include the day-to-day administration of programs, outreach efforts and staff. Generations is a special offering, based on your commitment, for the construction of ministry facilities that is above and beyond the tithe.

## What happens to the "Joelton Crossing the Jordan" and the "Loaves and Fishes" campaign?

We have had two other campaigns in the past 6 years. "Joelton Crossing the Jordan" was the campaign that helped us build the new sanctuary in 2000. "Loaves and Fishes" was the campaign that helped us raise the initial monies for this current project. These campaigns no longer exist, and all monies given for debt retirement or the children's building will be placed in the Generations account.
